Camp Hill, Nov. 30—By breaking glass and opening the latch in a rear door, the Atlantic and Pacific tea store in Camp Hill was entered last night and about \$15 in change was taken from the cash register. No stock was stolen.

The robbery was discovered at 8 o'clock this morning by William A. Eby, Lemoyne, manager of the store, when he opened for business. J. L. Traub, a neighbor, found the rear door opened, but did not enter until Eby came to the store.
